Bruins split first games

OMAHA - Right-handed pitcher Sean Potter threw six strong innings for the Beatrice Bruins baseball team Wednesday night as they downed the Omaha Strike Zone All-Stars, 2-0, at Burke Stadium in Omaha.

The Bruins scored both their runs in the top of the first inning and then held on for the win.

Potter, throwing in relief of starter Brian Feekin, held Strike Zone scoreless, while giving up two hits in six innings of work.

Potter threw just 55 pitches during his appearance and struck out seven batters.

"He (Potter) was very efficient with his pitches," Bruins manager Bob Steinkamp said.

Feekin threw the first three scoreless inning, giving up one hit, walking four and striking out five.

The win in Omaha evened the Bruins exhibition record at 1-1 to start the season.

Tuesday, the Bruins fell to the Lincoln Rocky Top All-Stars, 2-1.

Micah Busboom took the loss for the Bruins and was one of eight pitchers who saw action in the game.

The Bruins collected seven hits in the contest, but could manage to score just one run.

"We struggled mightily on offense," Steinkamp said. "We looked rusty at the plate."

Scott LeJeune led the Bruins offense with a double and single.

Next action for the Bruins will be tonight (Thursday) as they open MINK League play with a 7 p.m. home contest against the Topeka Golden Giants at Christenson Field.
